For drugs at a population level, the Centre for Crime and Justice Studies has launched national monitoring programme, the LICIT.





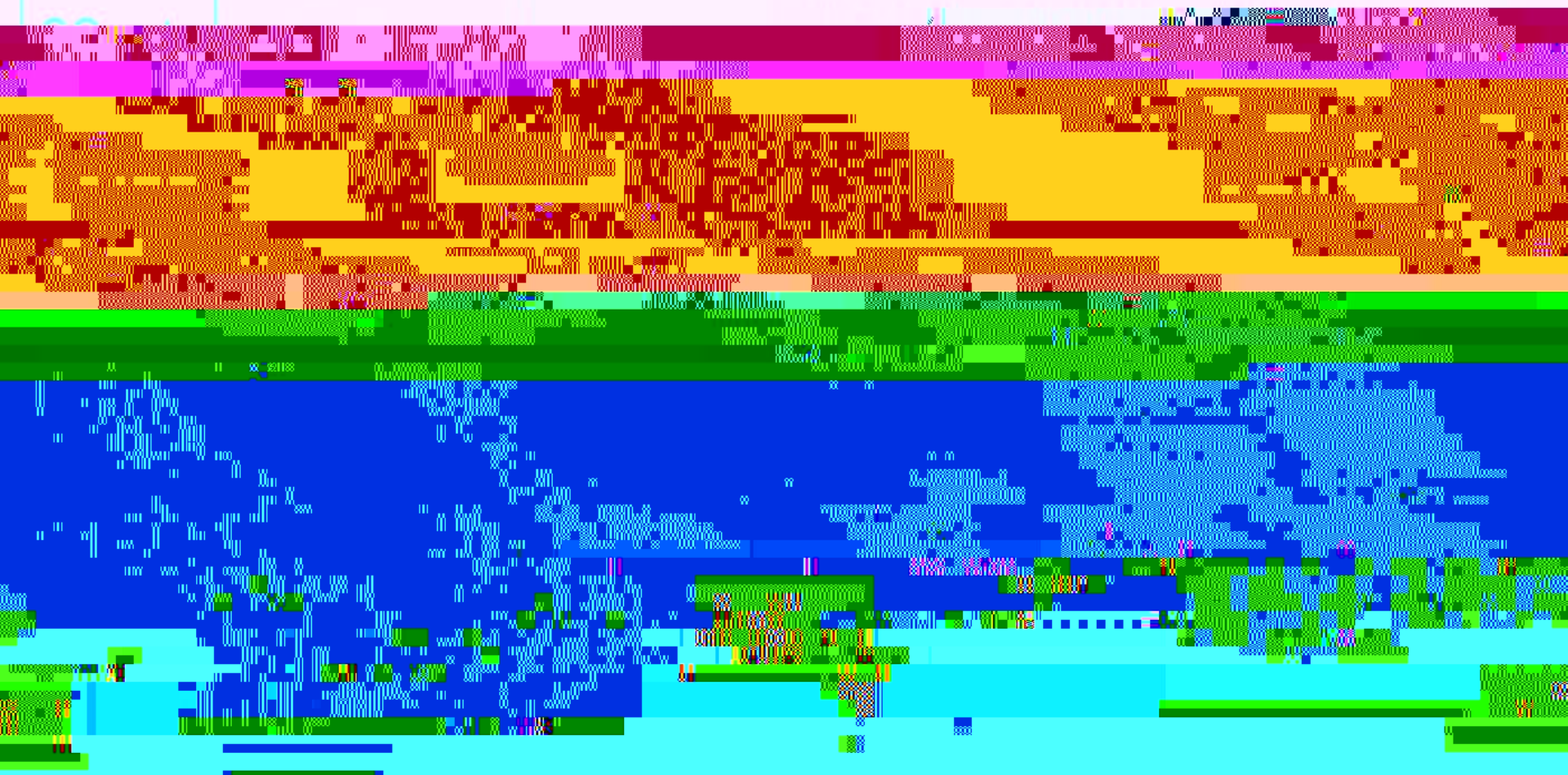


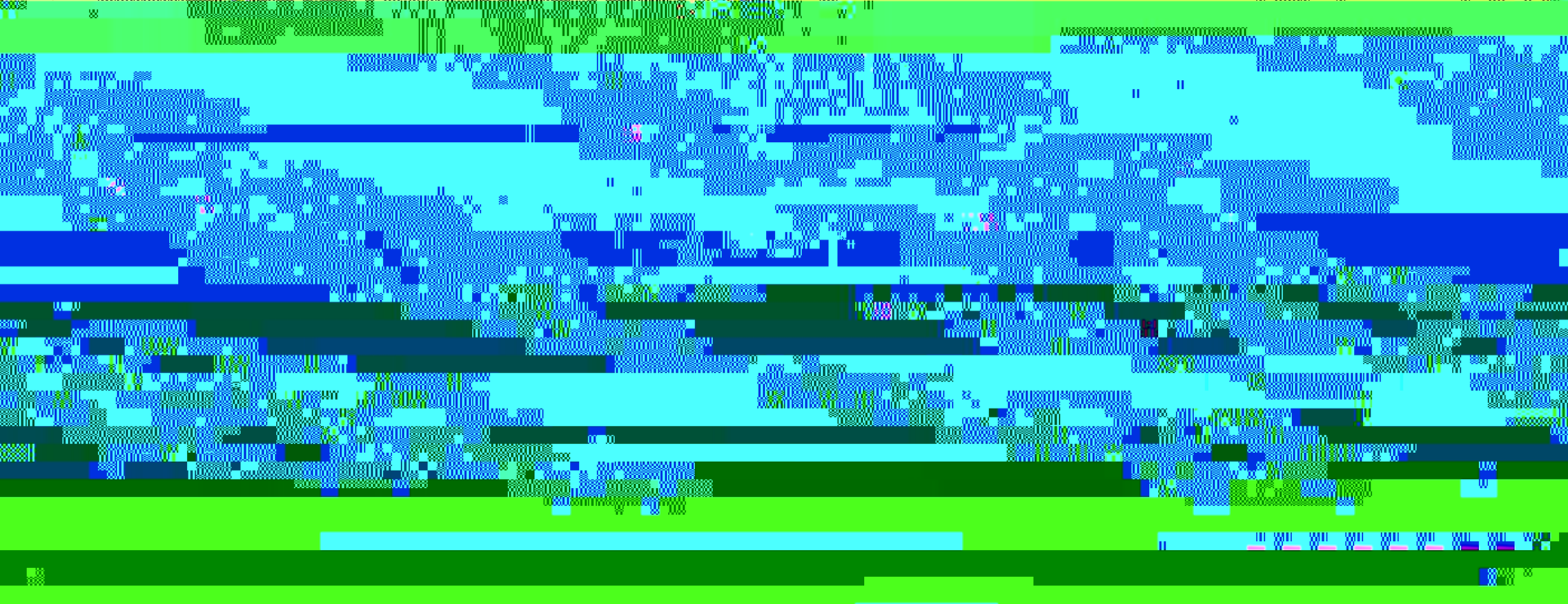
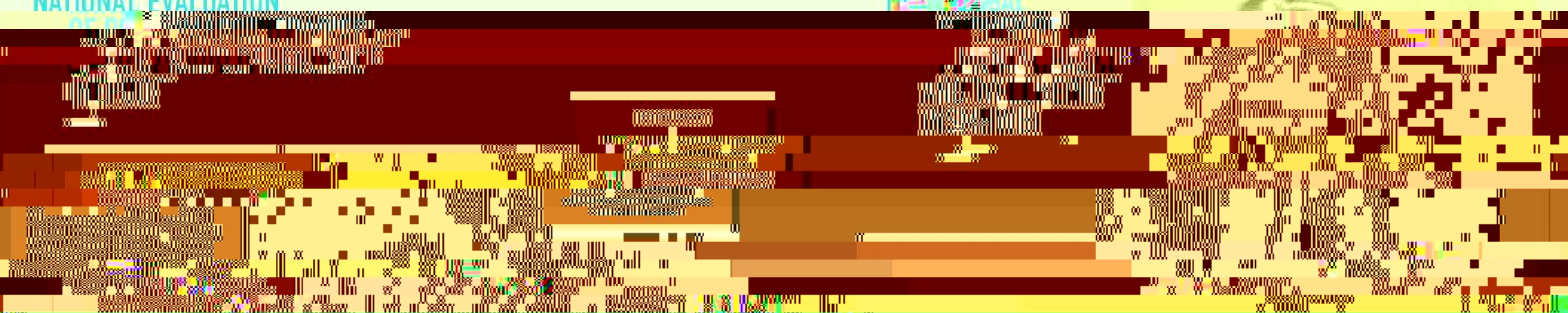
