## Assessment Details

### Assessment 1: Critical Writing Task

Start date:

Length: 50 words

Details: Students will write a short critical reflection (750 words) on a key concept or development. Students will receive individual written feedback and a mark within ten working days of submission. Students will also receive cohort feedback in class.

Turnitin settings: assignment is submitted through Turnitin and students receive individual reports.

### Assessment 2: Group presentation

Details: Students will work in groups of 4-5 to develop and deliver a presentation. All group members will receive the same grade. Students will receive written feedback and a mark within ten working days of completion.

### Assessment 3: Essay

Details: Research paper of 2500 words, to be submitted at the end of semester. This is the final assignment for this course. Students will receive written feedback and a mark within ten working days of submission.
