Program compulsory core & flexible core courses	Courses which students must complete under their enrolled degree e.g. Bachelor of Commerce (International) 3558
Commerce Major	A sequence of approved courses (48

Free Electives or Second major or Commerce minor	Account for 48-54UOC (8-9 courses). Students are free to use these UOC to complete courses from any Faculty however they need to be mindful of the program limit on Level 1 courses (84UOC) when making their selection. Ways to use these UOC include: completing a range of courses across different Faculties; completing a second business major or commerce minor; expanding the International Studies courses into a major or minor. Courses cannot double count in two majors.
