Terminology	Definition
Program compulsory core courses	Courses which students must complete under their enrolled degree e.g. Bachelor of Economics/ Science (Advanced Maths) 3564
Economics Major	Students must complete at least one major in Economics, Econometrics or Financial Economics consisting of 60UOC. The 60UOC includes 36UOC from the compulsory first and second year core courses. (ACCT1501 and ECON1401 do not count towards an Economics major.) Students must complete at least three (3) level 3 courses (numbered 3XXX).
Economics Elective	Account for 12-24UOC (2-4 courses) from the School of Economics to ensure a student completes a minimum of 84UOC of Economics courses within the School of Economics.
Free Electives	<p>Account for 12UOC (2 courses). Students are free to use these UOC to complete courses from any Faculty however they need to be mindful of the program limit on Level 1 courses (60UOC) when making their selection. GEN courses cannot count as Free electives.</p> <p>Students can choose to use the Economics free electives and free electives to complete a second major from the list of approved Economics majors. Compulsory major specific courses cannot double count in the two majors.</p>

Students must complete at least one major in Economics, Econometrics or Financial Economics.

Overlapping requirements: If you choose to do two Economics majors that have overlapping compulsory core courses, you do not need to complete them twice. However, if the two Economics majors have overlapping compulsory major specific courses, then you should only count the major specific course towards one Economics major and choose to do a major elective course of the same level in the other Economics major.
