Program compulsory core & flexible core	48UOC of compulsory and flexible core courses which students must complete under this degree.
courses	Maximum level one limit for the Commerce component is 60UOC.
Commerce Major	Students enrolled in a Bachelor of Commerce Bachelor of Education (Secondary) dual degree need to choose one major from: (a) Business Economics, (b) Financial Economics, (c) Business Strategy and Economic Management, and (d) Accounting.
	Students who intend to qualify as a secondary school teacher in business studies and economics AND also wish to gain associate membership of CPA Australia, or wish to enter the Chartered Accountants Program of Chartered Accountants Australia and New Zealand, are permitted to complete a major in Accounting instead of Business Economics, Business Strategy and Economic Management or Financial Economics. THESE STUDENTS WILL NEED TO COMPLETE THE COURSE REQUIREMENTS OF CPA AUSTRALIA OR CHARTERED ACCOUNTANTS AUSTRALIA AND NEW ZEALAND (please refer to the CPA or CA websites, noted below, for the requirements of the two bodies) AND ADDITIONALLY COMPLETE TWO 6 UOC ECONOMICS COURSES AT LEVEL
