Credit towards Law Masters programs may be granted for Masters-level law courses completed in postgraduate programs from a recognised institution as determined by UNSW Law - X V W L F H.

Credit transfer applications will only be considered for courses completed within the last 10 years and prior to commencement of the postgraduate program at UNSW Law - X V W L F H.

Credit transfer eligibility will be assessed taking the following factors into account:

The maximum credit that can be awarded for courses that have already been counted towards a completed program is 25% (i.e. a maximum of 12 Units of Credit toward the LLM).

Credit to a maximum of 6UOC may be granted for attendance at 18 hours of UNSW Continuing Professional Development (CPD) face-to-face seminars, for which a certificate has been awarded by UNSW Continuing Legal Education, and where the attendee has produced a substantial piece of legal writing (6,000 words) such as an academic paper on

a topic approved by the Director of Postgraduate Studies, a submission to government/law reform commission, or contribution to an official report. Eligibility requirements are set out in the application form.

Credit will not be granted on the basis of a completed Graduate Diploma in Legal Practice or Practical Legal Training studies.

Credit may be granted on the basis of other studies on a case-by-case basis subject to the provisions above.
